CALL FOR RESEARCH PROPOSALS, FEMA HIGHER EDUCATION PROGRAM

The Higher Education Program (HiEd) is seeking competitive research proposals from qualified candidates that examine complex real-world issues and provide actionable recommendations to help advance the discipline of emergency management.

To be considered for funding, proposals must:

- Come from individuals or teams currently associated with an accredited institution of higher education.
- Scoped for 3-9 months.
- Use the <u>Research Proposal Submission template</u> (https://training.fema.gov/hiedu/hiedresearch/researchproposaltemplate.aspx) format for submission.
- Topics must be in areas related to climate change, equity, and/or emergency management higher education and professionalization.

Reminder: Purchase a Ticket for Meals and Coffee Breaks at the Symposium

Meal ticket purchase (New procedure!):

- Go to <u>NETC Meal Tickets</u> (www.netcmealtickets.com) no more than 2 weeks prior to the course start date to purchase the meal ticket. The ticket will cover your evening meal on the arrival date through breakfast on your departure date.
- You will no longer be able to purchase meal tickets at registration upon arrival to the NETC.
- If you do not stay in a dorm room on the NETC campus, you must purchase the daily coffee break ticket.
