Reminder: Purchase a Ticket for Meals and Coffee Breaks at the Symposium

Meal ticket purchase (New procedure!):

- Go online to <u>NETC Meal Tickets</u> (https://www.netcmealtickets.com/) no more than 2 weeks prior to the course start date to purchase the meal ticket. The ticket will cover your evening meal on the arrival date through breakfast on your departure date.
- You will no longer be able to purchase meal tickets at registration upon arrival to the NETC.
- If you do not stay in a dorm room on the NETC campus, you must purchase the daily coffee break ticket.

If you have any dietary needs, send an email to FEMA-netccafeteria@fema.dhs.gov at least 2 weeks prior to your arrival at NETC. On May 2, 2022, FEMA opened the application period for the <u>Fiscal Year 2022 National Earthquake Hazards</u> <u>Reduction Program's State Assistance Program</u>, (https://www.fema.gov/emergency-managers/risk-management/earthquake/state-assistance-program-grants) including Individual State Earthquake Assistance and the Multi-State and National Earthquake Assistance grants. The notification is available online at <u>Grants.gov</u> (https://www.grants.gov/). In addition to detailing eligibility and submission requirements, these notifications



provide a program overview, with objectives, priorities, and allowable activities. The application period for both funding opportunities will end at 5 p.m. ET on June 1, 2022.
