Association of State Floodplain Managers (ASFPM) Future Leaders Scholarship. In 2018, ASFPM established the Future Leaders Scholarship (FLS) to provide direct financial assistance, mentoring, and support to a deserving college student. At the 2022 ASFPM National Conference, the ASFPM Foundation announced it will fund a second FLS beginning in 2023 to the tune of \$20,000 per year.

Call for Proposals - FEMA Region 8 and the University of Colorado's Natural Hazards Center – with additional support from the National Science Foundation – are excited to announce a joint effort to underwrite original research in the American West.

The goal is to provide **10 awards** in the amount of **\$4,000 each**. A successful application for funding will expand the understanding of the human and social dimensions of hazards, incidents, and disaster in FEMA Region 8 or across the American West. Proposals should have clear and feasible timelines that includes plans for data collection, analysis, and report writing. Proposals must include a statement describing how expected findings and outcomes can be used as actionable guidance for emergency managers for FEMA Region 8 and beyond.

Proposals will be accepted that focus on how preparedness for natural hazards impacts all other aspects of a natural hazard, as well as recent (last three years) and future (unfolding in the next 3 months) disasters.

All proposals should follow our **Quick Response Proposal Submission Guidelines**
